A QUICK LOOK AT MEDICAL REHABILITATION

DSWC began its service to the person affected by leprosy with medical rehabilitation. Till date it has medically rehabilitated more than 50000 patients, who are living normal life. It is wonderful to see these patients once out of their house, deserted by their own family members, now they have their own family and their offspring are doing well in the society. This year Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital conducted various activities besides the normal medical assistance given to leprosy patients. Here we will be highlighting only a few of them.

On 30th January World Leprosy Day or say Anti Leprosy Day was celebrated in collaboration of State Bank of India, who distributed wheel chairs to disabled people.



This year 42 persons underwent Re-constructive surgery conducted by Dr. Jacob Mathew. Thanks to Dr. Jacob from DFIT for RCS.



47 Persons underwent cataract operation



GNM students from Central Nursing School were given classes on clinical features & classification of leprosy, laboratory in laboratory, Role of physiotherapy in leprosy, health education in leprosy, Tuberculosis and its complication as well as dressing room assistance for leprosy patients. During the year Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital treated 329 MB and 93 PB patients, besides 328 Eye patients, 149 dental patients and 77 ortho patients.

A QUICK IMPRESSION OF EDUCATION REHABILITATION

Someone said, "A Man without Education is like a Building without the Foundation". Education is so very important in every person's life. That is why DSWC took the challenge to educate the children of leprosy patients. To begin with the education rehabilitation at Nirmala Hostel was started with 38 girl children of leprosy patients. Now it has grown so big that there are not only few children of leprosy patients, but also 100s of day scholars are also studying at Nirmala School.

Nirmala School aims at developing the children in totality, to make him/her a perfect creation of God. Top priority is given to character building in sound moral principles. Effort is also made to instill a sense of responsibility and true development of mind. Therefore besides bookish teaching various activities are undertaken for the benefit of the children.

This year Annual Sports was conducted, where Arup Chatterjee, MLA, Nirsa Vidhan Sabha Chhetra, was the chief Guest.



Karate competition was organized on 7th February and on 21st May International Yoga Day was celebrated.



Nirmala School submitted the online affiliation application to Central Board for Secondary Education, Dehli on 29th June 2016.

This year on the 70th Independence Day, the national flag was unfurled by Koizumi Hajime, the Principal of Rokko High School. On this occasion four German medical students viz. Tabea Franziska Wicher, Johannes Schaetzel, Karsten Roland Scheibl and Alexander Werner Limpert were also present as Guest of Honour.



In the quiz competition children from Nirmala School hold 1st seven position in the Junior groups.

In the Basketball Archana Tirkey and Sonali Mahato were selected to present state basket ball team taking part in Sub Junior National Basket ball tournament at Hyderabad on 28th September.



AN EYEBALL PRESENTATION OF ECONOMIC REHABILITATION

It is very difficult for an ordinary person to get a good job, so it could be easily imagined, how difficult it would be for physically challenged people or say for cured leprosy person to get a job. Therefore DSWC has taken initiatives of rehabilitating them in one of the units of DSWC called Baramasia Rehabilitation and Training Centre (BRTC), where cured leprosy patients, who are deserted by their own family members and now even after cure of leprosy they find difficult to get back to main stream society for any job AND if they are left to themselves, may end up in begging for their survival, are making bandages, gauzes, bed sheets, doormats, apron, shawl, carpets, lungies, and gamchhas. There are 85 such cured leprosy patients, who are living with much dignity.



DSWC has taken another initiative to motivating them to pool their own resources and form Self Help Groups in 21 leprosy colonies. At present there are 317 members in 21 SHGs with total savings of Rs 2,50,860 where Rs 83550 in hand and Rs 144310 in Bank. It is wonderful to see that women, who were begging and rag picking are now not only saving, but also 7 Self Help Groups are doing Income Generation Activities. These women were silent sufferer, but due to SHG movement in their colonies, they are able to come together and celebrate International Women's Day.



LET'S TAKE GANDER AT NURSING SCHOOL

To describe the relationships between the quality of patient-care and the education and experience of the nurses providing that care, there is a call for more nurses with baccalaureate degrees and more experienced nurses to work in hospitals. Therefore, Nirmala Nursing School is started that girls from the poor financial background could get proper training and not only become financial independent but also provide quality care to the patients. In the year 2016 Nirmala Nursing School, a unit of DSWC conducted various activities to provide good training to ANM students.

Capping ceremony for the 1st year students was conducted on 5th March. Commandant Bruno and Dept Commandant Sweta from Pradhankhanta CRP camp were the guest of honour.



As part of their training ANM students went to Park Clinic and PHC, Govindpur and Dhanbad. In all these places students learnt to take history of the patients, attend in the labour room, assist senior doctors and lab technicians.



ANM students also went to assist Dr. Karan's team to Deogarh health camp. Senior students went to Catholic Mission Hospital, Bargarh, Odisha, Holy Cross Hospital Kunkuri, Jashpur, Chhatishgarh, Dhori Mata Samaritan Seva Kendra, Jarandih, Bokaro, Jharkhand, and Military Hospital Panagarh, Burdwan, West Bengal for 5 months long INTERNSHIP.



Thanks to Dr. SK Karan, the President of DSWC, who allowed our ANM students to have different experiences in his hospital i.e., Park Clinic, Hirapur. Thanks to the Administrators of all the Hospitals, where ANM students went for Internship and gain much needed experience and confidence.

HAVE A RUN THROUGH AT DAMIEN VOCATION TRAINING CENTRE

While launching the National Mission for Skill Development 2015, Honorable Prime Minister acknowledged that "India currently faces a severe shortage of well-trained, skilled workers. It is estimated that only 2.3% of the workforce in India has undergone formal skill training."

Keeping this in mind Damien Social Welfare Centre started Damien Vocational Training Centre (DVTC) at Kaladih in view of imparting and the upgrading the technical skills and knowledge to unskilled and semi-skilled youth from the disadvantage and poor section of the society. It is basically started to create employment opportunities to the youth, who otherwise, having completed their schooling or sometime due to financial crunch in the families are school drop outs, are now unemployed and some are joining hands with illegal activities. The motto of DVTC is "SUCCESS THROUGH SKILL".

On 13th June 2016 Quality Control of India made a visit to DVTC in view of inspection and gave few remarks. DSWC corrected all the remarks given and reapplied for revisit. On 7th October National Council for Vocational Training (NCVT), approved DVTC to run two trades viz. Electrical and Fitter under its guidance. We can take only 21 students each for both the trades.



On 27th September 2016 Damien Vocational Training Centre (DVTC) was inaugurated by Fr. Vijay A Bhat, the former Director of DSWC, who had bought the land for vocational training, Sri. Arup Chatterjee MLA Nirsa, who donated tools and equipment for Fitter trade and Sri Brahamadev Laroia, who donated tools and equipment for Electrical trade. Most Rev Felix Toppo SJ blessed the training center.
