As you know it well that Damien Social Welfare Centre is in the service to the humanity for 'Anti Leprosy' work in all its aspects since 1964 and over the years it has not only been able to reduce the incidents of leprosy in and around Dhanbad, but also it has helped thousands of persons affected by leprosy to gain back their lost dignity. I am happy to share with you that particularly the year 2017 was significant for DSWC, as we were able to achieve some of the mile stones. Nirmala School, which was started in view of protecting the children of leprosy patients from leprosy by keeping them in the hostel, is affiliated to CBSE on 8th December 2017 and the number of the children is growing by every year. The technical school, which was started in Gomoh years back to bring the unskilled youth of leprosy background to the mainstream of the society and for various reasons, had been closed down, now under a new name i.e., Damien Vocational Training Centre, is restarted and affiliated to National Council for Vocational Training, New Delhi for conducting Electrical and Fitter trades. We also got the Unique ID from Neeti Aayog. Nursing School is going ahead strength to strength. Our rehabilitation center, which was always running at a loss, sees a growth in its production as well as in the sale of products. Hospital, was underutilized for a decade or so because, besides, leprosy treatment no other treatment was undertaken. Now it has opened up other departments and many doctors other than skin department are interested to get associated with the hospital and to offer their services. I believe it is all because of you, my friends and well-wishers, who constantly become ambassadors of DSWC and speak well of us.

I want to thank all of you who have helped us to scale to these new heights, each in your own way and according to your own means and I am counting on your renewed support in 2018 so that we can achieve more!

I would also like to thank and congratulate the secretary and the entire team of DSWC, who are working tirelessly for the growth of DSWC.

Leprosy – the very word causes people to dread! Not merely because it mutilates the body and leaves the victim crippled for life, but even more because it deprives men, women and children affected by it, of self-respect and dignity and also segregates from the society. The cause of the victims of leprosy was, for many years, a neglected cause. We, at Damien Social Welfare Centre (DSWC), Dhanbad started our service towards this forsaken and forgotten community with medical rehabilitation and eventually we put our effort in mainstreaming the members of this community. And over last 53 years, DSWC has worked tirelessly to cure those affected by leprosy, and also to remove the stigma attached to the disease. And with God's help, we have achieved significant success. There is noteworthy reduction in the spread of the disease.

However, still some amount of stigma remains with the people suffering from leprosy. Our effort in bringing more general patients to the hospital is bearing very little fruits. However, in the school children from leprosy background are competing shoulder to shoulder with the children from different backgrounds. I am happy to share that in 2011, there were only 166 students children in the school where 111 children were from the hostel, all of them from leprosy background and now come to 2017 the number of children in the school went up to over 1100+, where only 240 children from the hostel and rest all are day-scholars. We, at DSWC, are aware that we need to put more effort to get away with this stigma. However, this is a huge achievement that we are making progress in all the units, beginning from Hospital, to School, to rehabilitation, to Nursing School and to technical school.

I am overwhelmed with gratitude to you all, for your generosity towards DSWC and I belief and hope that you will continue to support the cause of DSWC of providing quality medical service to all the marginalized people especially the persons affected by any stigmatic or communicable disease so as to lead them towards their total wellbeing and fullness of life. Looking forward to journeying together in even more eventfully in coming year 2018.

It is with heartfelt gratitude and a great sense of achievement; I present this Annual Report for the year 2017. The articles and the photographs present only a glimpse of our work in various units, the difference we have made in the lives of those we work for and work with as well as the challenges we faced.

As an organization, we are committed to healing, inclusion and dignity of children, women and men affected by leprosy. Our focus, on ensuring human dignity, comes from the fact that man is created in God's own image. To us ensuring dignity not only means giving voice to the voiceless and promoting their integration into the community as productive members, but also how we, as an organization, respect them in the way we develop and implement our programs and how we portray the needs of those affected by leprosy.

Before I share the highlights of the year, I take this opportunity to express sincere thanks to Sr. Roshna CSS, who was taking care of and guiding the Hostel children and now have gone for the higher studies. We also like to thank Sr. Anju CSS, who was offering her services at our home for the disabled and also assisting at all the operation taking place in the hospital. She is gone for new mission. Thank you so much sisters and all the best for your future ministry. We like to give a warm welcome to Sr. Noel CSS and Sr. Manzil CSS, who have joined Nirmala family.

Now I begin with Nirmala Hospital. With the support of Damien Foundation India Trust (DFIT) 58 leprosy affected disabled persons underwent Reconstructive surgery. Thanks to DFIT for their generous support. Besides treating patients affected by leprosy, one of the significant progress made by DSWC is that of starting dental department, where 216 patients with dental problem got treatment during the year. Even in the eye department Nirmala Hospital conducted 43 cataract operations and with the support of Somedi Nettetal, Germany, Hospital conducted a free mobility camp, where 313

people with different physical deficiencies benefitted by getting hearing aid, artificial limbs, crutches and calipers. It is to say Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital remains no more a hospital for the leprosy patients alone, but it also takes care of general patients.

Coming to the School, DSWC experienced especial blessing of Nirmala Mother i.e., Immaculate Virgin Mary, when on 8th December i.e., on Nirmala Day, Nirmala School got affiliated to Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. Thanks to God and all the members for this achievement. During the year Annu Oraon not only played under 18, or National Youth Basketball tournament, but also played National Senior Basketball tournament at Chennai. One of the big achievements was Sonali Mahato from Nai Duniya colony, Jharia was selected as the best player in the State Sub Junior Basketball tournament. She also led Jharkhand team for the National Sub Junior Basketball Tournament at Jaipur. Three other girls from Nirmala School also played in the same tournament.

It is matter of joy to all of us at DSWC, when we are able to provide 100% placement to all the students doing ANM training at Nirmala Nursing School. This is one of the units of DSWC, where DSWC is putting all its effort to make the girls from underprivileged section of the society economically independent. And in the same vigor DSWC has started Damien Vocational Training Centre, where unskilled and semi skilled youth could be trained as Electricians and Fitters to get jobs. Here, I must mention, that Baramasia Rehabilitation and Training Centre, is not far behind when it comes to economic rehabilitation. It is the unit, which was started to rehabilitate cured and disabled leprosy patients, and had been running at lose for years together. This year DSWC seems to make progress even in this unit, where we are able to make more transactions.

All these achievements of the year and the way we faced challenges are a result of the commitment and hard work of all my colleagues and the support and encouragement given by the Patron, President and the members of our Governing Board. With deep sense of gratitude to them, I place their efforts in our records. I am thankful to all our supporters and donors, partners and members of DSWC, who have played a significant role in making a difference in the lives of those affected by leprosy, disability and other marginalized. I am humbled and amazed at God's faithfulness and goodness to us as an organization and I am grateful for that.

This year Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital conducted 43 Cataract Operation besides treating 958 patients with eye deficiencies.

NEWS FROM DAMIEN VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE PVT. ITI

Damien Vocational Training Centre (DVTC) was established in 1974 by Late Fr. Lawrence J Hunt, S. J. in the campus of De Britto House, Gomoh, a unit of DSWC, Dhanbad. It was taken further by Fr. Joseph Lacey, S.J. At that time it mainly focused on training children of Leprosy Patients in welding, carpentry, fitter, motor mechanic-driving, agriculture, plumbing, mason, tailoring, embroidery and cane chairs and tables making. Unfortunately as the time passed by because of various reasons the center started deteriorating and finally in 2009 this center was closed down. However, Fr. A. Vijay Bhatt, the Director of DSWC (1986-1995), in view of shifting Damien Vocational Training Centre (DVTC) from Gomoh had bought a piece of land in Kaladih Dhanbad close to Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital, Govindpur. In 2014, the year of Golden Jubilee of DSWC Fr. Bipin Pani, Director DSWC, with the help of Manos Unidas, Spain constructed the Training Centre and restarted the vocational training. Now it is affiliated to NCVT for two trades viz. electrician and Fitter. However, this centre is also utilized for various short term trainings.

From 22nd January 2017 to 25th March 2017 two months long Ameen (Land Measurement) training was conducted at Damien Vocational Training Centre, Kaladih More, Govindpur, Dhanbad. 29 boys from in and around Govindpur block participated in the training. During the training they were taught about a) Tools & equipments, scales, Geometrical Construction, b) Classification of Survey, Signs & symbols and c) Types of Survey like Chain Survey, Compass Survey and Plane table Survey. At the end of the training participants were given Certificate of participation.

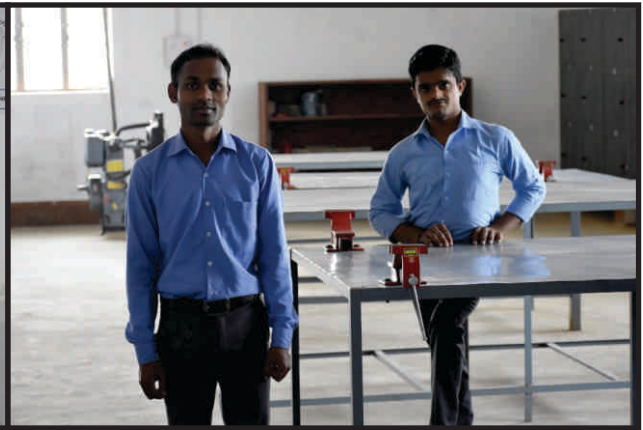

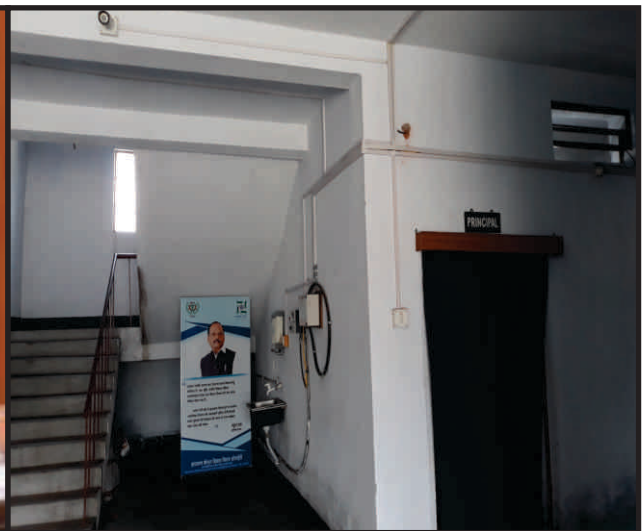

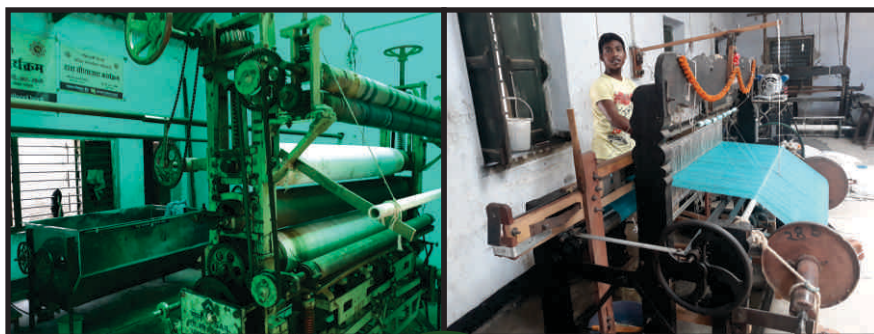
NEWS FROM BARAMASIA REHABILITATION & TRAINING CENTRE AND COLONIES

The best part, of these above mentioned SHGs, is the members of these SHGs are from leprosy colonies, who were habitual beggars. Now they are saving money every month and also doing some Income Generation Activities, which was unimaginable few years back.

During the year BRTC had production of Rs 17, 02, 015, Sale of Rs 17, 67, 363 and collection of Rs 14, 79, 941.
