It is my pleasure and privilege to present the report of what we at Damien Social Welfare Centre did in the year 2015. This report is a reflection of the goodness and faithfulness of God, the commitment and hard work of each staff member, the support of our donors, help of our Well Wishers and those who give us the privilege to work - those who are forsaken and forgotten and whose lives are affected with leprosy.

The year was an eventful one bringing challenges and changes. We started the year 2015 with Re Constructive Surgery (RCS) supported by Damien Foundation India Trust (DFIT). The year under review had seen 52 persons starting the normal life due to RCS. Thanks to DFIT for because of them DSWC could restart this service to the deformed poor persons after 17 long years.

With the joint support of Somedi, Nettetal, Germany and Ratna Nidhi Charitable Trust (RNCT), Mumbai, DSWC, organized Mobility Camp. Thanks to Somedi and Ratna Nidhi Trust.

On 14th November World Diabetic Day was celebrated, where 81 persons had diabetic checkups and 53 persons were found with diabetic concerns. Besides these Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital, treated 14206 patients during the year. Hospital had 139 eye patients, 136 dental patients, 110 ortho patients and 276 physio patients. Hospital provided treatment to 325 MB patients and 91 PB patients during the year.

45 students doing Diploma in General Nursing Midwifery from Central Nursing School, Dhanbad were given classes on different aspects of leprosy and taking care of the persons affected with leprosy. DSWC also conducted survey where 12 MB and 23 PB cases were reported during the year under review.

We are grateful to God for the service of Dr. Somnath Chaudhary, who served the organization particularly Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital, a unit of DSWC, for more than eight years. Towards the end of the year, he has to move to Ranchi for the treatment of his only daughter. Thanks to Dr. Somnath for his selfless service. We also thank Sr. Amal Jose CSS, Sr. Rennie, CSS, and Sr. Litty CSS, who had empowered DSWC through their committed service in restoring the lives of people affected by leprosy and now moved to new places as per the requirement.

We are very happy to WELCOME Sr. Servia CSS, Sr. Rosmi CSS and Sr. Mary Jacob CSS, who have joined DSWC family to render their service in the Hospital.

In the month of August DSWC had a good news from Government of Jharkhand, when Human Resource Department, Jharkhand issued No Objection Certificate (NOC) to Nirmala School, Govindpur, a unit of DSWC. Now Nirmala School can apply for affiliation to Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi. This would open new doors for these children coming from deprived section of the society, whom DSWC is educating.

8 Guides of our School represented Jharkhand in the national level Scout and Guide program held at Kerala from 23rd January to 27th January. On 5th September Sr. Vandana Baa, CSS, the Principal of Nirmala School, Govindpur was honored by Lions Club, Govindpur for her contribution towards the upliftment of the children from the deprived section of the society. It is a big recognition of the work of DSWC, as through Nirmala School.

In view of economic rehabilitation DSWC is conducting Auxiliary Nursing Midwifery (ANM) course, affiliated to Indian Nursing Council, New Delhi. In February the first batch of ANM had their capping ceremony and the second batch of 20 students arrived in October.

This year with the help of Manos Unidas, Spain, DSWC is constructing training center called Damien Vocational Training Centre, for school graduate youth and school drop outs youth to impart job oriented skills.

With the support of Missio, Munich, DSWC has formed 20 women Self Help Groups in the colonies, with total savings of Rs. 2,01,150.

We cannot thank enough for what God has done this year for DSWC. As we were closing the year 2015 Bishop Felix Toppo S.J., the Patron of DSWC, blessed the marriage of Sandhya Maria Pandey, the deaf and dumb girl, one of the orphan girls of DSWC. Thanks so much to Bishop Felix.

Finally, I must say that none of this would be possible without the generosity of our Donors, Benefactors and well wishers within India and outside India. We are also very mindful of the contribution made by many individual donors of Dhanbad town, who make DSWC's life changing work a reality.

I do not forget all the staff of DSWC, who tirelessly worked to serve the people from the disadvantage section of the society. Thanks to everyone.

And finally I thank God for His faithfulness because of which we not only look back in gratitude at the past year but also look ahead with hope at the challenges we face in the coming year. We look forward with great excitement to your continuing support in the coming year.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE HOSPITAL

This year has been particularly year of blessings for the persons affected with leprosy. One of the blessings came in the form of Reconstructing Surgery, when Damien Foundation India Trust (DFIT) agreed to collaborate with Damien Social Welfare Centre to make use of the Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital (NGLH) to bring solace to the deformed leprosy patients.

It is Dr. S.P. Sood, State Consultant NELP, Jharkhand who worked hard to initiate discussion with DFIT and later on invited Dr. Shivkumar, Dr Rajkumar to visit Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital. Thanks to Dr. Sood and DFIT for restarting RCS almost after 17 years.

During the year RCS was conducted in three phase. 52 deformed leprosy patients from districts of Dhanbad, Dumka, Gumla underwent RCS. Thanks to Dr. Jacob Mathew, who travel all the way from Chennai to conduct these RCS. Thanks to Dr. R.I. Singh from Namdhari Research, who assisted Dr Jacob Mathew as an anesthetist. Thanks to Sr Suchita, who was kind enough to come from Amda, Rajkharswan to be the part of RCS team and help our staff. Thanks to Mr. John Peter, the first Physiotherapist from DFIT, Mr. Rashbihari, the present Physiotherapist from DFIT, Sr. Anju, CSS, Mr. Srinath, Nurse Fransina, Nurse Sangeeta, without whom RCS would not have taken place. Special thanks to Sr. Litty CSS, who lead the process of RCS in the initial stages.

The other important activity, which was organized during the year, was Mobility camp. It was 2 days visit of Mr. Stefan Voormans of Somedi Nettetal, Germany along with his friend Mr. Ronney and his nephew Peter and Niece Sushy on the first day of the year 2015, which gave birth to the idea of organizing a Mobility Camp for all those who need caliper, crutches, Jaipur-foot and hearing aid. Stefan took initiative to speak to Ratna Nidhi Charitable Trust (RNCT), Mumbai for the possibility of organizing Mobility camp at our campus. He also spoke to his board at Somedi Nettetal, Germany for sponsoring the camp.



HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE HOSPITAL

Finally two camps viz. screening camp and fitment camp were organized in two phases. About 850 persons came for the camp and 401 persons were screened for the artificial limbs. 224 persons received hearing Aid, 78 persons received Jaipur-foot, 45 persons received crutches and 54 persons received calipers.

Thanks to the Team from Ratna Nidhi Charitable Trust, Mumbai lead by Nandini Thakkar. Thanks to Dr. SN Sharma, Dr. Ganesh, who spared time from their busy schedule and helped DSWC to conduct screening of the patients having hearing difficulty. Thanks to all the ANM students, who were always ready to offer their assistance during the camp. Thanks to all the staff, who worked hard to make the camp a success.



With the initiative of Dr. Sunil Sinha from Central Hospital Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital celebrated World Diabetic Day on 14th November 2015. On this day a free Diabetic checkup camp was organized, where 81 persons had diabetic checkups and 53 persons were found with diabetic concerns.

We invoke God's blessing for all the staff working in the hospital May God continue to bring healing to all the patients.

A GLIMPSE OF NIRMALA SCHOOL

The school, which was started to take care of children of leprosy patients way back in 1968, is growing strength to strength. At present it is not only catering the educational need of girl children of leprosy patients, but also under the inclusive education Nirmala School is catering the educational need of children from all the deprived section of the society. At present Nirmala Girls' Hostel has 252 girls of leprosy patients and 868 children in the school.

In the month of August DSWC had a good news from Government of Jharkhand, when Human Resource Department, Jharkhand issued No Objection Certificate (NOC) to Nirmala School, Govindpur, a unit of DSWC. Now Nirmala School can apply for affiliation to Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi. This would open new doors for these children coming from deprived section of the society, whom DSWC is educating.



On 5th September Sr. Vandana Baa, CSS, the Principal of Nirmala School, Govindpur was honored by Lions Club, Govindpur for her contribution towards the upliftment of the children from the deprived section of the society. It is a big recognition of the work of DSWC, in the field of education.



DSWC continuously puts effort to give all round growth to the children by conducting different classes like Scout & Guide classes, school Band class, music class, Karate class, Dance Class, Basket ball coaching and different competitions among the students.

QUICK LOOK AT NIRMALA NURSING SCHOOL

In view of economic rehabilitation for young girls coming from deprived section of the society, DSWC started a new unit in the month of October 2014. The name of the unit is Nirmala Nursing School, Govindpur, where DSWC has a plan to train girls who are not able to go beyond 10+2 education and become a victim of poverty. On 15th July 2014 Indian Nursing Council approved 20 seats for 2 years Auxiliary Nursing Midwifery (ANM) training.

In October 2014 Nirmala Nursing School was inaugurated by Mannan Malik, then Minister of Jharkhand of Animal Husbandry and Fishery of Dhanbad. In the first batch we have 10 students.





In February 2015 ANM students of first batch had their capping ceremony. During the year they completed their PHC visit and clinical experience in the hospital. They also visited school for the special children as part of their curriculum.



In the month of October 2015 second batch of 20 students arrived at Nirmala Nursing School.

BEGINNING OF DAMIEN VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE

Having started Nirmala Nursing School, Govindpur the management of DSWC had been continuously reflecting on doing something concrete for the boys from the weaker section of the society especially the boys from our leprosy colonies. In view of this DSWC got support from Manos Unidas, Spain, to construct training center called Damien Vocational Training Centre (DVTC), for school graduate youth and school drop outs youth to impart job oriented skills.



At DVTC, DSWC has plan to impart formal training in Fitter and Electrician for 10th pass boys and girls and short term courses in Motor Mechanic, Computer, Spoken English and one year electrician course for the school dropouts boys, whereas for the school dropout girls DSWC will provide tailoring and Beautician courses. Hope this would equip youth with necessary skill to enable them to get employment and become breadwinner in their family.



HAPPINESS AND HOPE FROM LEPROSY COLONIES

DSWC has 21 leprosy colonies in Dhanbad, where persons affected with leprosy find difficult to meet their two ends meet. They have to go for begging, rag pickings, and daily wages work. Their life has become a bundle of problems, which cannot be tackled individually but can be better solved through group efforts. Though the effort had been from 2010 onwards to make Self Help Groups, because Self-help group is a way of organizing poor and marginalized people to come together to solve their individual problem. The real Self Help Groups started to be formed only from 2013 onwards.

With the support of Missio, Munich, DSWC has formed 20 women Self Help Groups in the colonies, with total savings of Rs 201150. These Self help groups have become the vehicle of change in the colonies. As all of us know a life of dignity is the right of every citizen. Poverty is an obstruction to a dignified life. Self-employment is a significant step to have sustained incomes and remove the shackles of poverty. Therefore, having conducted various training, DSWC is able to assist 9 SHGs for doing Income Generation Program Viz. a) Jharkhand Swen Sahayata Samuh & Gandhi Mahila Samity are doing Ready Made cloth business. They are supplying some cloths to few shops in the local market as well selling door to door. B) Jyoti Mahila Samity Premnagar and Shoshit Mahila Samity, Chandmari are doing goat rearing and small petty business. C) Maa Durga Samity, Bhaljoria and Saheli Swen Sahayata Samuh, Phulwari Tand are doing piggery, D) Pragati Mahila Samity, Palatand and Unnati Mahila Samity, Palatand are doing Turmaric Grinding, and E) Asha Swen Sahayta Samuh has a small shop with educational articles for the children

On 12th March, all these SHGs gathered in the campus of Nirmala School to celebrate International Women's Day. Mrs Dipti Jayraj, the Joint Commissioner of Central Excise, was the Chief Guest of this celebration. She said that in spite of having much responsibility in every family, women have to come out of their houses and draw inspiration and strength from each other. Working in the groups takes away lot of our burden.



These women have come long way from begging to saving. DSWC is trying to instill self believe in them. Once they know the power of working together, they will be able to solve lot of their problems

A GLANCE FROM BARMASIA REHABILITATION AND TRAINING CENTRE

In early 1970 there were many persons affected with leprosy in Dhanbad. Whole day they used to wander place to place begging for their survival and at night wherever they reached that was their shelter under the open sky. It was Fr. Larry Hunt S.J., then Director of Damien Social Welfare Centre rightly thought to rehabilitate these leprosy patients at Baramsia sometime in 1974. It was started to bring back the lost dignity of these leprosy patients so that they would not be begging anymore, but live with self respect. Though the journey of rehabilitating began with making of different bamboo products, but they have come long way in last four decade.



Though this center is running in deficit, DSWC continues to support these cured leprosy patients for if this center is closed down due to lack of finance, these patients will go back to their old occupation of begging. Thank God that at present 90 families are rehabilitated here. And they make bandages, gauzes, apron, OT gaun, Bed sheets, door mats, shawl, gamchha, lungi, duster and carpets. They are able to educate their children in the school and colleges. We hope more and more cured leprosy patients are rehabilitated and work of Baramasia Rehabilitation and Training Centre is known by many especially the Government.



IT IS SANDHYA'S TURN

One fine evening in 1994 a baby girl was left by her parents at the gate of then Nirmala Leprosy Hospital and now Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital, Govindpur. Fr. Vijay Bhat, then Director of DSWC immediately informed the police about it and took every effort to find her parents, but with no success. Having done every possible way to find out the parents of this girl, finally DSWC adopted her as one of its own daughters. Her name was given SANDHYA, as she was found in the evening. Mr. Hardhan Pandey and Marina Pandey gave her their name and thus Sandhya came to be known as Sandhya Maria Pandey. She grew up as deaf and mute girl, preparing food for the sisters and the fathers at Nirmala Ashram.



God is kind enough to find a suitable match for this girl in the person of Arenson Kateyar, who is also deaf and dumb. On 24th November this couple got married. DSWC was kept closed on the day, as beloved child of Nirmala was getting married. Bishop Felix blessed the marriage. Fr Amatus Kujur preached during the wedding Mass. Fr. Vijay, Fr. Raphael Materio, Fr. James Surin, Fr. Nicholus Kerketta, Fr. Elvius, the Deputy Director DSWC and Fr. Bipin, the Director DSWC concelebrated. A big gathering witnessed this wonderful marriage.


