

Now, I would like to highlight few achievements and development which took place regarding Nirmala Leprosy & General Hospital, Govindpur. We continue to keep our total commitment and attention for the cure and the prevention of Leprosy patients who are undergoing each day with emotional and mental agony more than their physical.

Through the help of Damien Foundation of India Trust (D.F.I.T) we are able to treat the leprosy patients with some deformity cases. In 2018 we conducted 75 Reconstructive Surgery for the leprosy affected people. We are truly blessed with the passionate work of DFIT for bringing holistic healing to the patients who regain their dignity and confidence to cope up with the life. On the other hands, besides taking care of the leprosy patients we also carry our mission to take care of the general patients. We treated 345 cases of dental, 725 cases for Eyes deficiencies and 10478 for skin diseases. This year we conducted 109 Cataract -Operation besides treating 1759 patients with eye deficiencies. 30 cases were dealt with General Cases - Hydro seal, Hernia and High diabetes. We conducted 22 major and 46 minor surgeries. We can proudly say that Nirmala General & Leprosy Hospital remains no more for the leprosy patients alone but also



This is an Organization run by D.F.I.T whose head quarter is in Chennai (India). Few years back already M.O.U (Members of Understanding) was signed and agreed upon to conduct Re Conduct Reconstructive Surgery (R.C.S) with deformities cases. To our surprise Nirmala Leprosy & General Hospital is one of the leading Hospitals in entire Jharkhand State to conduct various surgeries successfully. In 2018 we conducted 75 Reconstructive Surgery and in 2019 up to now we have conducted 48 so far.
